






SWEATBAND.

Application filed December 19, 1922. Serial No. 607,783.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAX RAPPAPORT, a citizen of Russia, residing at New York, county of New York, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Sweatbands, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in sweat bands, and it is the principal object of the invention to provide a sweat band of the character described in my copending application, Serial No. 525,686, filed December 29, 1921, with depressions having varicolored bottoms in order to simulate the holes and colored bands used heretofore on sweat bands for hats and caps, thus achieving the novel, useful and important result of saving material, time and labor.

Another object of the invention is to provide sweat bands with depressions of square, triangular, multicornered, starlike or other contours, the bottom parts of which are colored or multi-colored.

A further object of the invention is the process of making the sweat bands.

These and other objects of my invention will become more fully known as the description thereof proceeds, and will then be more specifically pointed out in the appended claim.

In the accompanying drawing, forming a material part of this disclosure.

Figure 1 is a top plan view of a sweat band constructed according to the present invention.

Figure 2 is a similar view of a modified form of my invention.

Figure 3 is a top plan view of another modified form of my device, and

Figure 4 is a similar view of a still further modification of my invention.

The body portion 10 of the band or blank is provided with a curved line 11 along which the flap is formed and its upper and lower edges are cut as at 12 and 13 so that after the flap 14 has been formed along line 11, the band will be ready for attachment to a hat or cap.

A plurality of depressions 15 is formed

in band 10 which may be square as at 16, round as at 18, elongated as at 17, triangular as at 19, or star-shaped as at 20, or have any other desired shape or form.

The bottoms of these depressions are colored as for instance green for the square depression 16, purple for the round and elongated depression 18, 17 blue for the triangular depressions 19, and red for the star-shaped depressions 20. It will be clear that the colors indicated by the shading in the drawing are only illustrating an example of coloring the bottom parts of the depressions and that any other color may be used.

The bands or blanks are also provided with a central depression 21, square or otherwise shaped and bearing any desired legend.

It will be clear that the sweat bands made according to the present invention are ready for sewing and that the making of the depressions can be done quickly and the time and labor consumed for punching holes, drawing the bands through the holes and for pasting the ends of the bands to the material is saved so that an important step forward in the art is effected as the saving of time and labor is considerable and a great advantage in the manufacture of these bands.

As stated above, I have illustrated in the drawing the preferred forms of my invention only as an example, and it will be clear that changes may be made in the general construction as well as in the arrangement of the minor details without departing from the scope and spirit of my invention.

What I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent is:

A sweat band or the like, having the material thereof depressed at regular spaced intervals longitudinally of the band with the depressions of uniform width, the bottoms of the depressions being colored to thereby simulate a colored strip loosely woven through the band.
