


DESIGN FOR A RIBBON-CASE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 31,482, dated August 29, 1899.

Application filed August 4, 1899. Serial No. 726,203. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK H. MAURER, a citizen of the United States, residing at New Berlin, in the county of Union and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a certain new and original Design for Ribbon-Cases; and I do declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

The invention relates to a new and original design for ribbon-cases; and it consists of a design of the configuration shown in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the invention, and Fig. 2 is a top plan view.

The leading features of the design consist in the top and bottom pieces *a* and *b*, each of

which has a diagonal edge *c*, an edge *d*, extending at an obtuse angle to the edges *c*, an edge *e*, extending at a right angle to the edge *d*, an edge *f*, extending at a right angle to the edge *e*, and an edge *g*, extending at a right angle to the edge *f* and joining the diagonal edges *c* at the point *h*.

i denotes vertical posts.

j denotes doors.

What I claim is—

The design for a ribbon-case as herein shown and described.
