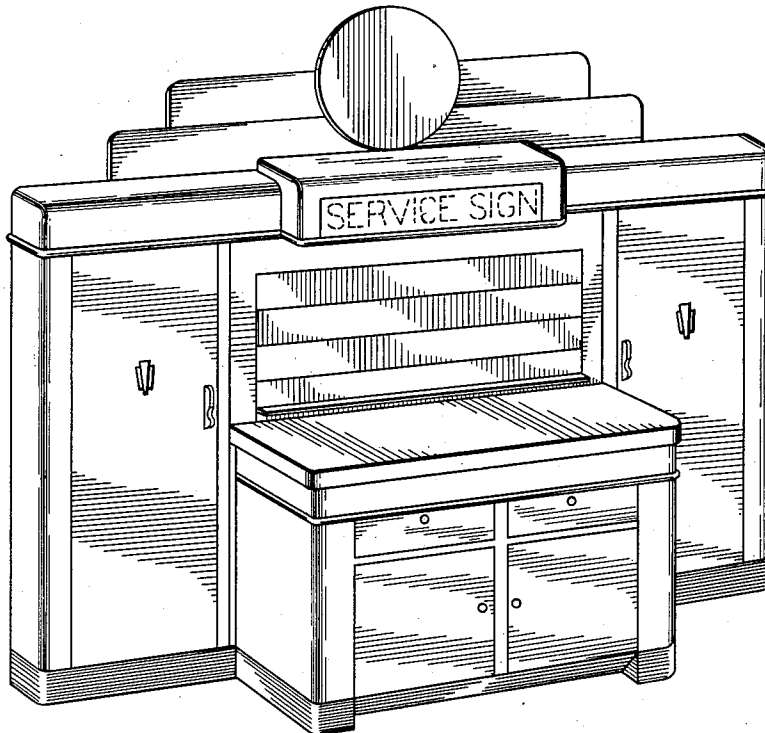

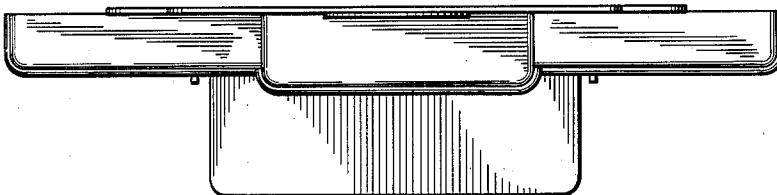

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Charles W. MacMillan, a citizen of the United States, residing at Jackson, in the county of Jackson and State of Michigan, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Combined Workbench and Cabinet or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
