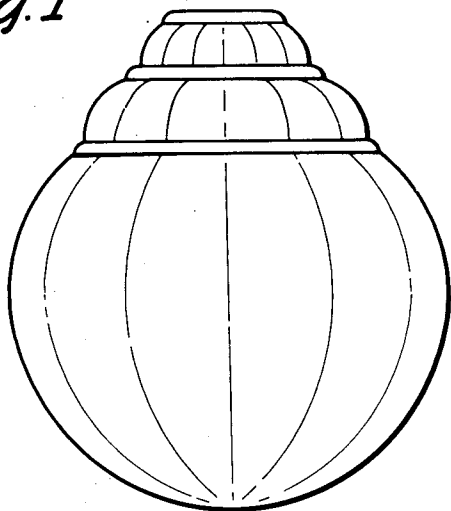

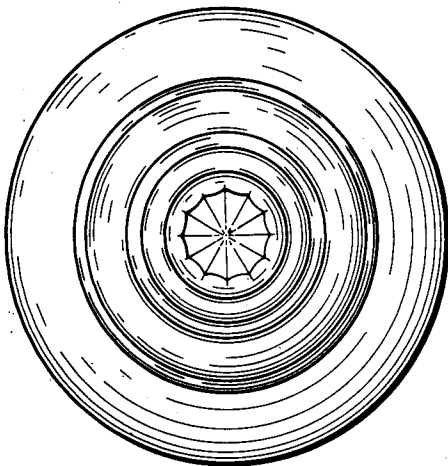
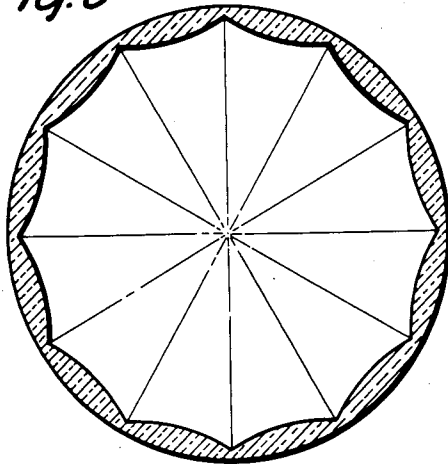

DESIGN FOR A FLOWER HOLDER

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Samuel Cantor, a citizen of the United States, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Flower Holder, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a side elevation of a flower holder showing my new design.

Figure 2 is a plan view of the flower holder.

Figure 3 is a sectional plan thru the holder.

The flower holder is made of relatively thin glass with the outer surface smooth and with the interior surface formed in scallops, as shown.
