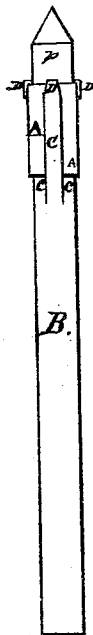

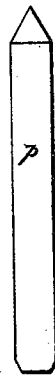
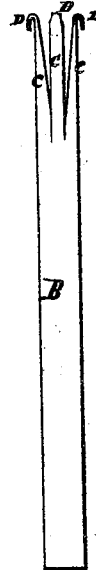

IMPROVEMENT IN PENCIL-HOLDERS

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, ANNIE J. HALL, of the city and county of San Francisco and State of California, have invented an "Improved Pencil-Holder;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters marked thereon.

This invention consists of a rigid tube provided with fingers of peculiar construction, in combination with an elastic tube, as will be fully described.

In the drawings—

Figure 1 is a pencil, crayon, or chalk holder having my improvement.

Figure 2 is the elastic ring or tube A.

Figure 3 is a pencil, *p*.

Figure 4 is the metallic or inelastic tube B, having prongs or fingers C.

To enable others skilled in the art or science to which it most nearly appertains to make and use my invention, I will proceed to fully describe its construction and operation.

It will be seen that the prongs or fingers C are pro-

vided with hooks or stops, D, formed by turning over the ends of said fingers to prevent the escape of the ring A.

When the holder is manufactured for the use of small children, the details are arranged as shown in fig. 1, with each alternate finger passing outside the ring A and the stops D, turning alternately inward and outward.

For the use of larger children, the ring A is placed outside of all the fingers C, and the stops D are turned outward.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The elastic tube or ring A, in combination with the tube B, when the latter is provided with the fingers C and stops D, as described, for the purpose set forth.
