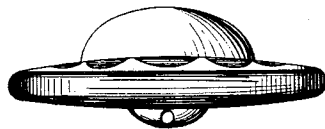
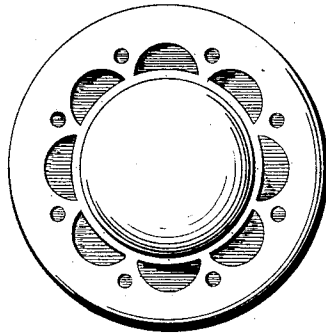

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUDOLPH LIEBMANN, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York city, borough of Manhattan, in the State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Buttons or Similar Articles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a face view of a button, showing my new design, and Fig. 2 is an edge view of the same.
