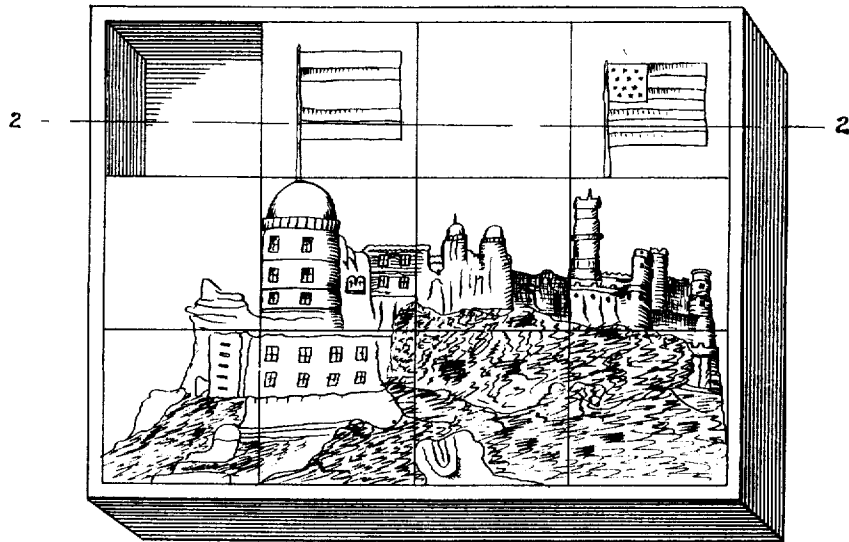
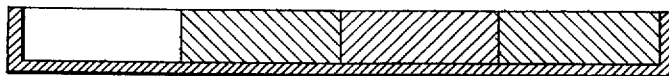

DESIGN FOR A GAME-BOARD.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 29,649, dated November 8, 1898.

Application filed September 29, 1898. Serial No. 692,242. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

5 Be it known that I, CONRAD F. STEIN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Bridgeport, Fairfield county, State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Game-Board, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, and in which—

10 Figure 1 is a perspective view of a game-board, showing my novel design. Fig. 2 is a cross-section on line 2 2 of Fig. 1.

15 As shown in the drawings, the leading or material feature of my design consists in the representation of a coast scene, upon which appears a series of substantial buildings, form-

ing a castle of ancient appearance, from the main tower of which is displayed a Spanish flag. An American flag is also shown over the buildings, but detached therefrom, the whole game-board being shown as arranged in a box. 20

Having thus described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is— 25

The design for a game-board, substantially as herein shown and described.
