


DESIGN FOR A GAME-BOARD.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 29,649, dated November 8, 1898.

Application filed September 29, 1898. Serial No. 692,242. Term of patent 31 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CONRAD F. STEIN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Bridgeport, Fairfield county, State of Con-5 necticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Game-Board, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying draw-

ings, forming a part thereof, and in which—
Figure 1 is a perspective view of a gameboard, showing my novel design. Fig. 2 is a
cross-section on line 2 2 of Fig. 1.

As shown in the drawings, the leading or material feature of my design consists in the 15 representation of a coast scene, upon which appears a series of substantial buildings, form-

ing a castle of ancient appearance, from the main tower of which is displayed a Spanish flag. An American flag is also shown over the buildings, but detached therefrom, the 20 whole game-board being shown as arranged in a box.
