



DESIGN FOR A GROCER'S CAN-STAND.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,152, dated March 21, 1876; application filed November 29, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ZACHARIAH R. TRAVER, of Detroit, in the county of Wayne and State Michigan, having originated and designed a Stand for Bulk and Package Cans, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the main stand or frame; B

B, the superimposed shelves or stand; C, the can for bulk goods; D D, the package cans.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a bulk and package stand, consisting of a top and bottom piece, A A, connected by standards C, and the circular shelves B B, of decreasing diameter, mounted on a central standard, substantially as described and shown.
