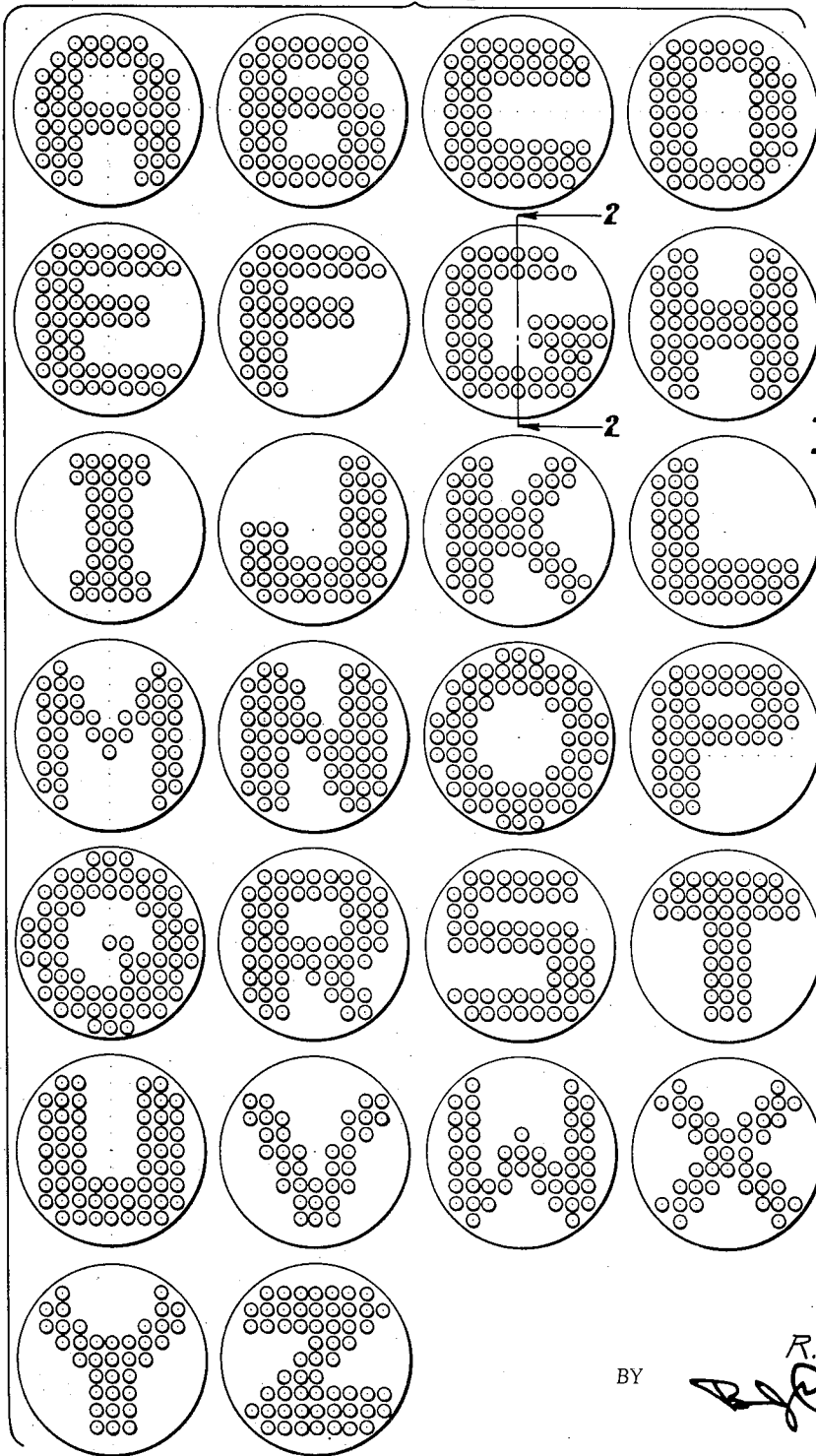
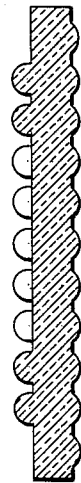

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Raymond H. Osbrink, a citizen of the United States and residing at Los Angeles, in the county of Los Angeles and State of California, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Molded Glass Alphabet Lenses for Forming Signs or the like, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

In the accompanying drawing, Fig. 1 is a plan view of the molded glass alphabet for forming signs or the like, showing my new design; and

Fig. 2 is a sectional view taken on line 2—2 of Fig. 1.
