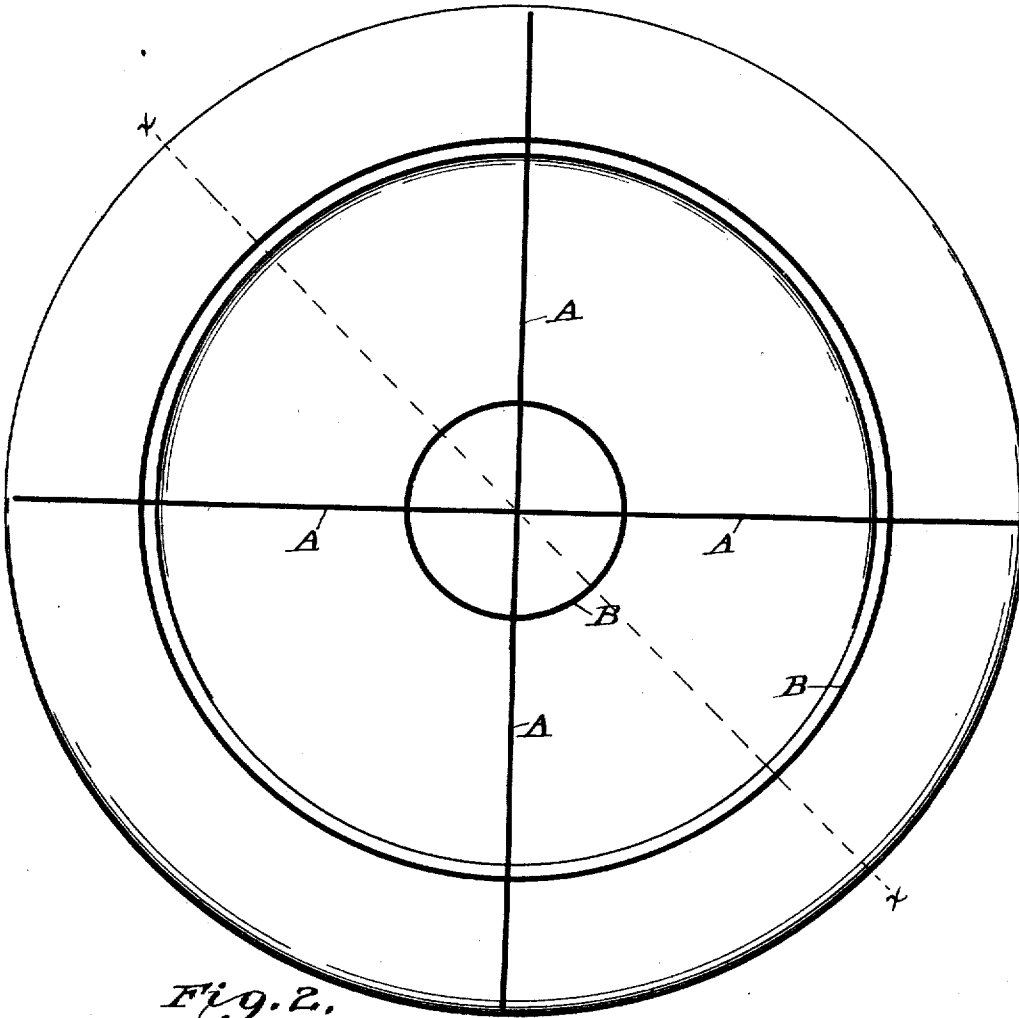
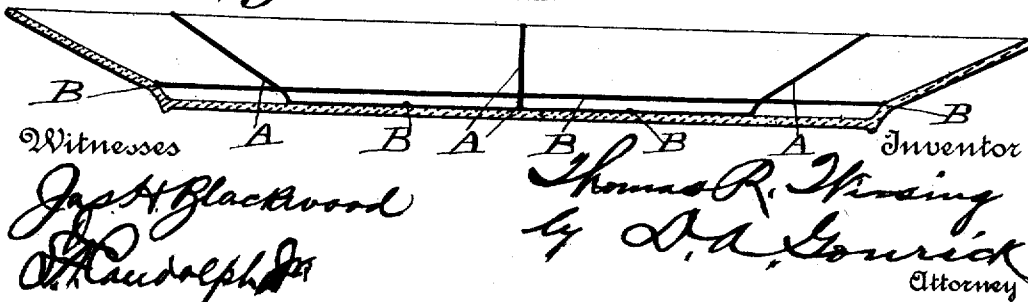

DESIGN FOR A PLATE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 32,949, dated July 17, 1900.

Application filed March 29, 1900. Serial No. 10,707. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS R. WIRSING, a citizen of the United States, residing at New Castle, county of Lawrence, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Plate, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

10 Figure 1 represents a plan view of a plate, showing my new design thereon; and Fig. 2 is a sectional view on line *xx* of Fig. 1.

As shown in the drawings, my design consists of a plate with a series of radiating lines
15 A, extending from the center to the circumference thereof, and a series of concentric

circles B, intersecting said radiating lines, said radiating lines following the contour of the plate.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a plate as herein shown and described.
