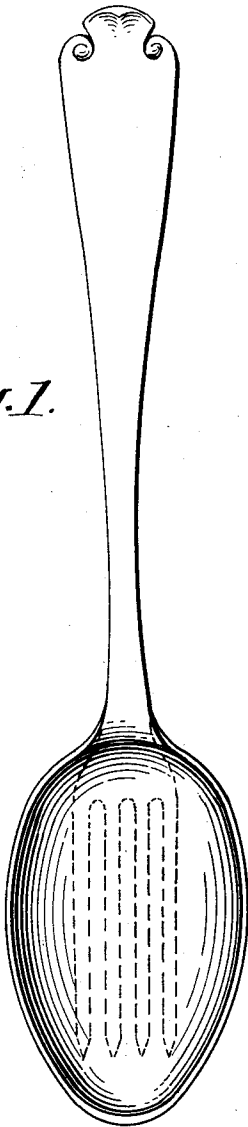
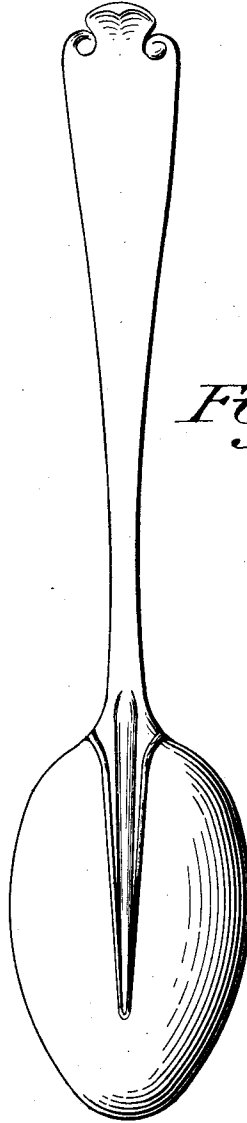

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALBERT ANGELL SOUTHWICK, a citizen of the United States, residing at No. 24 Gramercy Park, in the borough of Manhattan, city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Handle for Spoons, Forks, or Similar Articles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figures marked Nos. 1 and 2 are views representing respectively the front and back of a handle for a spoon, fork, or similar article, showing my new design.
