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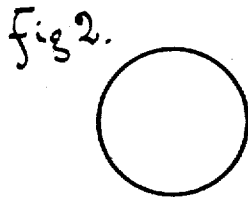
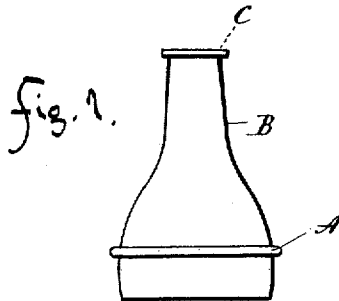

DESIGN FOR A BODY FOR OIL-CANS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 24,670, dated September 10, 1895.

Application filed July 22, 1895. Serial No. 556,833. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARK L. SPERRY, of Waterbury, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Bodies of Oil-Cans; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent, in—

Figure 1, a side view, and Fig. 2 a transverse section.

This invention relates to a design for the bodies of oil-cans, and the design consists in the configuration as shown in the accompanying illustrations.

As herein shown, the design consists of a body, circular in cross-section. From the

base it curves slightly outward to an annular bead A, from whence it curves upward and inward, forming a long neck B, terminating in a narrow flange C, the outline of the portion of the body above the bead being practically a continuation of the outline of the part below the bead.

I claim—

The design for the bodies of oil-cans, as herein described and shown in the accompanying illustrations.
