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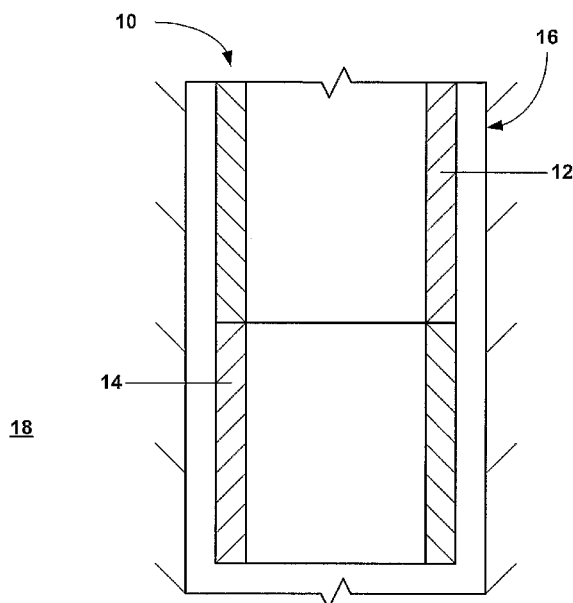

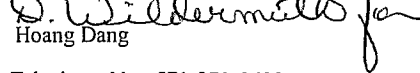

Group IV, claim(s) 65-72, drawn to an expandable tubular member.

Group V, claim(s) 73-76, drawn to an expandable tubular member.

Group VI, claim(s) 81-94, drawn to an expandable tubular member.

The inventions listed as Groups I-VI do not relate to a single general inventive concept under PCT Rule 13.1 because, under PCT Rule 13.2, they lack the same or corresponding special technical features for the following reasons: The special technical feature of the claims of Group I is the composition of the tubular member. The special technical feature of the claims of Group II is the yield point of the expandable tubular member before and after a radial expansion and plastic deformation. The special technical feature of the claims of Group III is the anisotropy of the expandable tubular member. The special technical feature of the claims of Group IV is the expandability coefficient of the tubular member. The special technical feature of the claims of Group V is the tubular member having a higher ductility and lower yield point prior to a radial expansion and plastic deformation. The special technical of the claims of Group VI is the different yield points between inner and outer tubular portions.

The claims of Groups 1-6 lack unity because each of the Groups depends on a different special technical feature as pointed out above.
