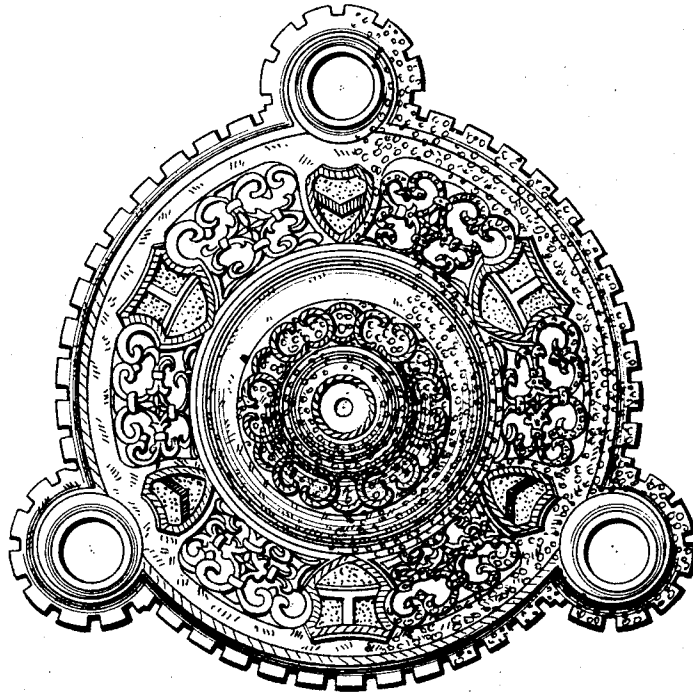

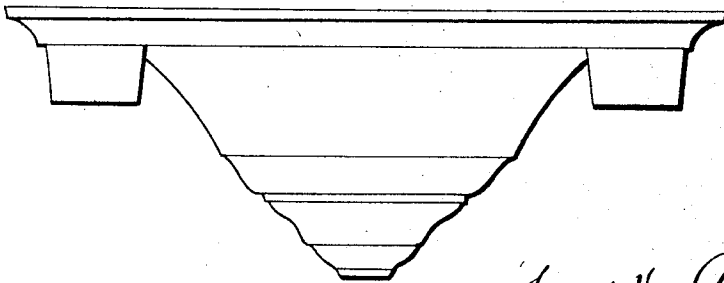

DESIGN FOR A LIGHTING-FIXTURE PLATE OR ANALOGOUS ARTICLE.

Application filed September 19, 1928. Serial No. 28,217. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE H. ALTBACH, a citizen of the United States and a resident of 395 Schenectady Avenue, borough of Brooklyn, county of Kings, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Lighting Fixture Plate or Analogous Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof,

In the drawing:

Figure 1 is a front elevational view of the lighting fixture plate or analogous article; and

Figure 2 is a diagrammatic edge view of the same.
