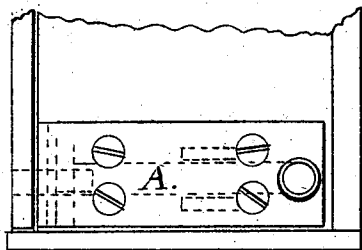
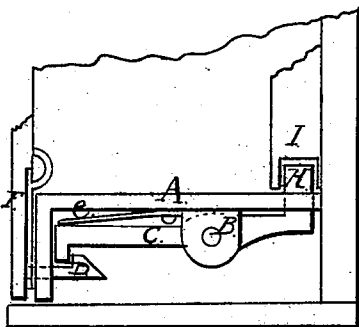

IMPROVEMENT IN SHUTTER-FASTENINGS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, PHILIP T. SHARE, of the city of Baltimore and State of Maryland, have invented certain Improvements in Window-Shutter Fastenings, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my invention consists in a right-angled metal frame recessed into the window-sill, flush at top and outer edge, holding a pivoted latch beneath that fastens to the hook on the shutter at one end, while the other projects upwardly through the cast frame, immediately under the bottom rail of the sash.

Figure 1 of drawing is a plan view of the fastener, and

Figure 2 is a transverse section of the same.

The shutter-holder consists of the frame A, having

a fulcrum-jaw, B, in which to pivot the latch C. This latch has a hook projecting at right angles at the outer end downwardly, and a pin at the inner end upwardly, to be pressed upon when it is desirable to unhook the shutter from the latch.

I claim as my invention—

The latch B, pivoted in a recess beneath the sill, locking at one end into the hook D upon the shutter, and furnished at its other end with the pin H projecting into the sash, and covered by a recess in the bottom rail, as and for the purpose herein described.
