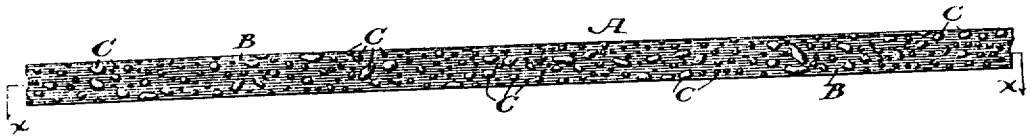

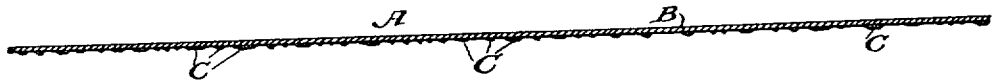

## DESIGN FOR TRIMMING MATERIAL.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,163, dated January 11, 1898.

Application filed November 5, 1897. Serial No. 657,571. Term of patent: 31 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY BERNSTEIN, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Trimming Material, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design for trimming material is a strip of material with spots on the face thereof.

Figure 1 represents a plan view of a piece of trimming material embodying my invention. Fig. 2 represents a longitudinal section thereof on line  $x x$ , Fig. 1.

In the drawings, A designates a piece of trimming material, the same consisting of the strip B with spots C thereon. The face of said strip has the appearance of stripes, and the spots are irregular in shape and size.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a trimming material substantially as shown and described.
