DESIGN FOR TRIMMING MATERIAL.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,163, dated January 11, 1898.

Application filed November 5, 1897. Serial No. 657,571. Term of patent 31 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY BERNSTEIN, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, State of 5 Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Trimming Material, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design for trimming material is a strip of material with spots

on the face thereof.

Figure 1 represents a plan view of a piece of trimming material embodying my inven-5 tion. Fig. 2 represents a longitudinal section thereof on line xx, Fig. 1.

In the drawings, A designates a piece of trimming material, the same consisting of the strip B with spots C thereon. The face of said strip has the appearance of stripes, and the 20 spots are irregular in shape and size.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is--

The design for a trimming material sub- 25 stantially as shown and described.
