


MATTRESS.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 24,302, dated June 7, 1859.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY W. HENLEY, of Iscribe its construction. New York, in New York county, in the State of New York, have invented a new and Im-5 proved Mattress; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

Figure I. is a view of my improved mattress in which A, A show the mattress and B, B, the serrated sections used in its manufacture, and forming the mattress. Fig. II. is a sectional view of the serrated sections 15 used in the manufacture of the mattress, and

designated as B, B.

The nature of my invention consists in the employment of a series of serrated sections in the manufacture of a mattress, 20 which sections divide the mattress into compartments, and form apertures or perforations running vertically entirely through the mattress for the ingress and egress of the air and thereby effect a most perfect and 25 complete ventilation.

To enable others skilled in the art to make

and use my invention I, will proceed to de-

In manufacturing, I employ a series of serrated sections, each made separate and at- 30 tached at the ends, employing any known means for stuffing said series of sections when complete forming the mattress. By this means a most perfect ventilation is attained.

I am fully aware that it is no new invention to effect ventilation by the use or employment of perforations. I am also aware that sections have been previously employed for the purpose of producing ventilation.

What I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent is—

The use or employment of the serrated sections B, B, when the same shall be com-

bined for the purpose specified.
