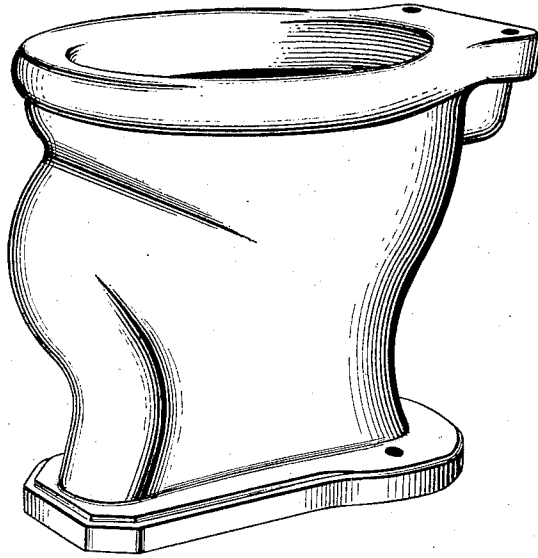
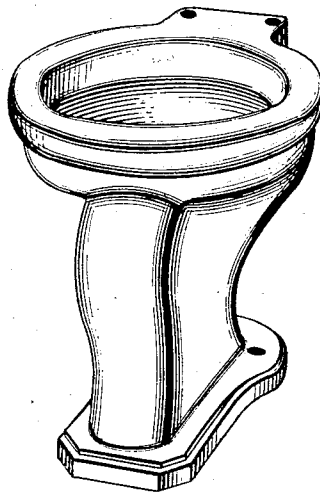

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW COCHRAN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Trenton, Mercer county, New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Water-Closet Bowls, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, in which—
