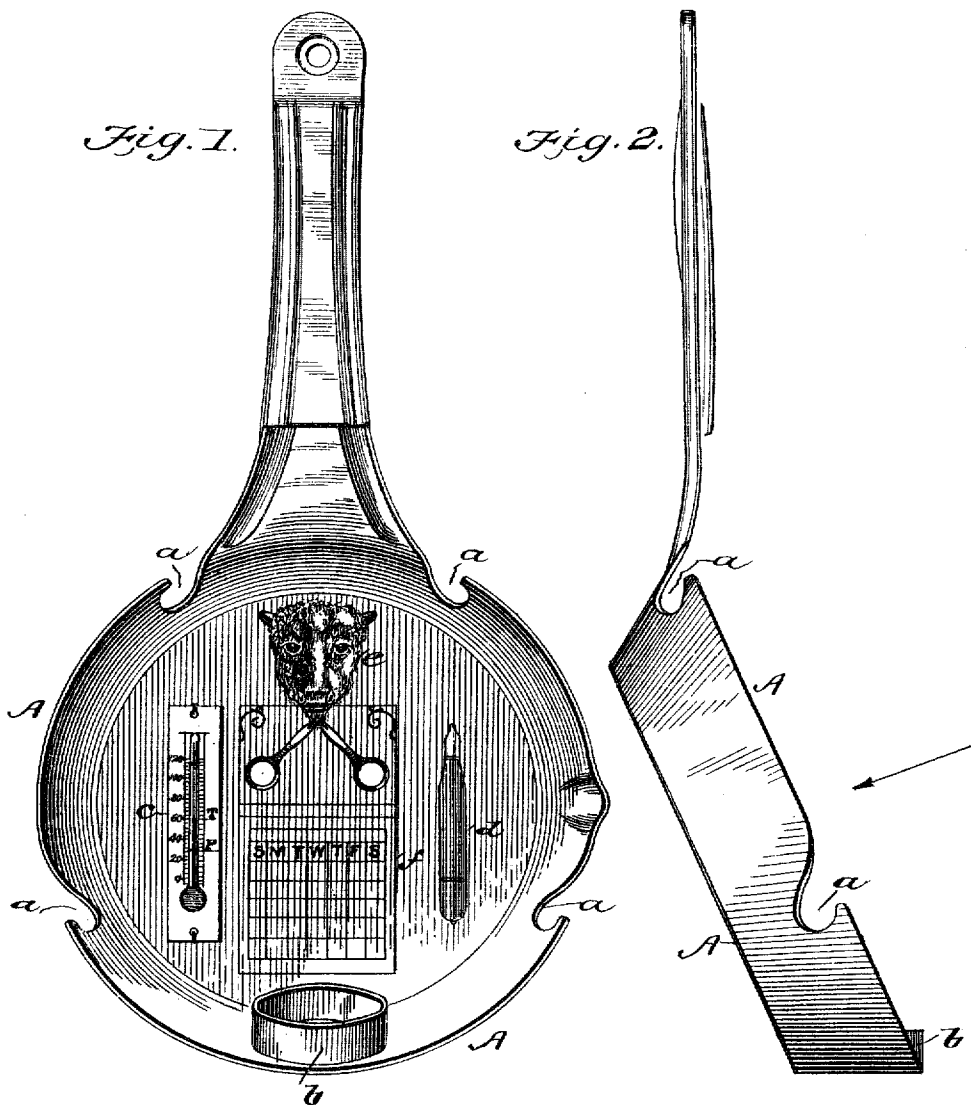

DESIGN FOR A PEN, PENCIL, AND INK HOLDER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 33,676, dated December 11, 1900.

Application filed November 16, 1900. Serial No. 36,782. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMILE BICK, a citizen of the Republic of France, residing at Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Pen, Pencil, and Ink Holder, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a face view; and Fig. 2 a side view of the pen, pencil, and ink holder, showing my new design.

The main portion of the device is in the form of a stew-pan.

The leading features of the design are the form of the body A of the pan, the same having notches *a* in its rim, as shown, and a cir-

cular flange *b*, located within the rim and on the lower side of the same.

The features of the design are arranged on the bottom of the pan A—to wit, a thermometer *c* and weather-indicator or barometer *d*, a representation of a bison's head *e*, and two stew-pans arranged below, and a calendar *f*, located between the thermometer and barometer.

What I claim is—

The design for a pen, pencil, and ink holder substantially as shown and described.
