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(54) Title: MULTI-LAYER MESOPOROUS COATINGS FOR CONDUCTIVE SURFACES, AND METHODS OF PREPARING THEREOF

(57) Abstract: Provided herein is a method of coating a conductive surface with a multi-layer mesoporous structure, by coating a conductive surface with a first photocatalytic dispersion to form a first layer over the conductive surface, curing or partially curing the first layer at temperatures of less than 400°C to form a porous structure, and coating the porous first layer with the one or more additional photocatalytic dispersions to form one or more additional layers that can penetrate or partially penetrate the pores of the structure in the first layer. The first photocatalytic dispersion includes photocatalytic particles, polymeric binder and a dispersion medium. The one or more additional photocatalytic dispersions include photocatalytic particles and a dispersion medium.
