

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,675, dated May 4, 1886.

Application filed December 7, 1885. Serial No. 185,022. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN A. KIESELHORST, a citizen of the United States, residing at the city of St. Louis, in the State of Missouri, have 5 invented and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Money-Box, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of the same.

10 The figure is an elevation of my design, showing the front and one end view of a toy money-box in the form of a miniature upright piano.

15 The leading feature of my design consists in the conventional representation of an upright piano as a toy money-box.

A in the figure represents one of these toy money-boxes in the conventional shape of an upright piano.

In the figure, *a* shows an elongated slot or opening made through the front wall of a miniature conventional upright piano.

At or near the bottom of the design is the representation of a slide or drawer, *a'*.

Having described my invention and design, 25 I wish to secure the same by Letters Patent of the United States by claim, as follows:

The design for a toy money-box, as herein shown and described, the same consisting of a conventional representation of a miniature 30 upright piano having the elongated opening *a* and the representation of a drawer, *a'*, as shown.
