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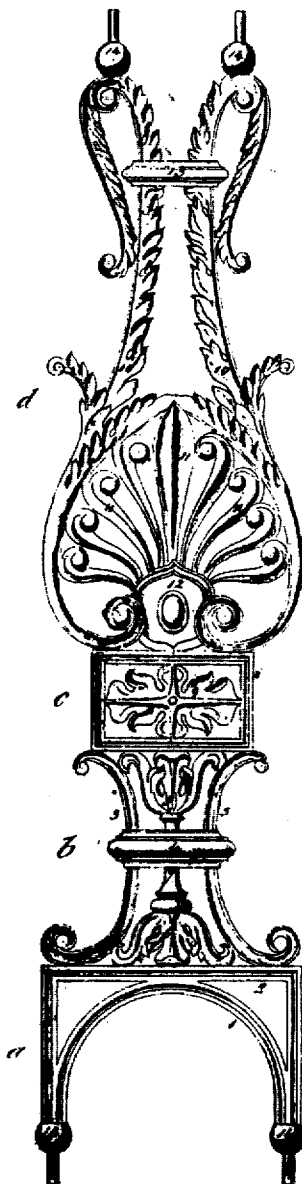

To all whom it may concern.

Be it known that I Nicholas P. Horton, of the County and State  
 aforesaid have invented or produced a new ornamental Design for Railings and I do hereby  
 declare the following to be descriptive thereof reference being had to the annexed Drawings  
 making part of this specification.

The design may be said to consist of several Members as follows.

Member A is a semicircular bead (1) enclosed and circumscribed by a rectangular  
 one (2).

Member B consists of two scrolls (3) united by fillet (4) and having their intervening space  
 occupied by a pair of Fleur-de-lis terminals, (5, 6) upon a stalk (7).

Member C, consists of an open rectangular bead (8) enclosing a rosette (9).

Member D consists of a pair of Lyre formed scrolls (10) enclosing a group of three tendrils  
 (11) in the form of a Grecian Acroteria, springing from a shield (12) the neck of the Lyre is  
 bound with a fillet (13) Balls (14) terminate the End Members.

What I claim as my invention and Design to secure Letter Patent for is a design for ornamen-  
 tal Iron Railings as described in the above specification and illustrated in the accompanying  
 drawings.
