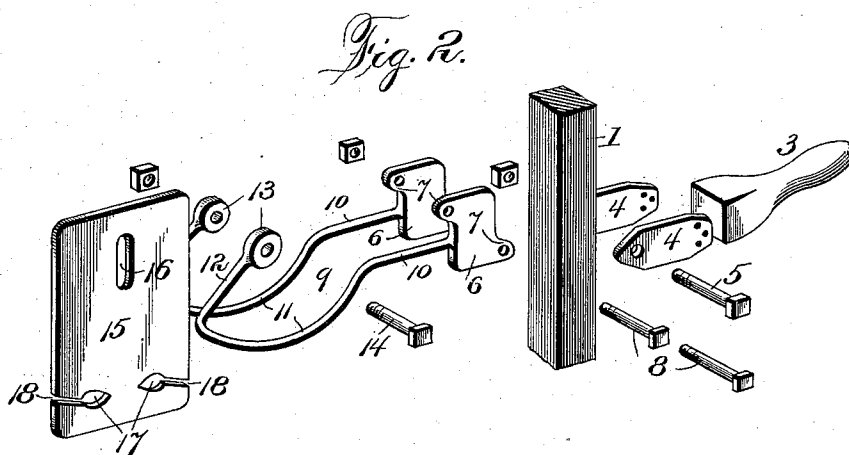
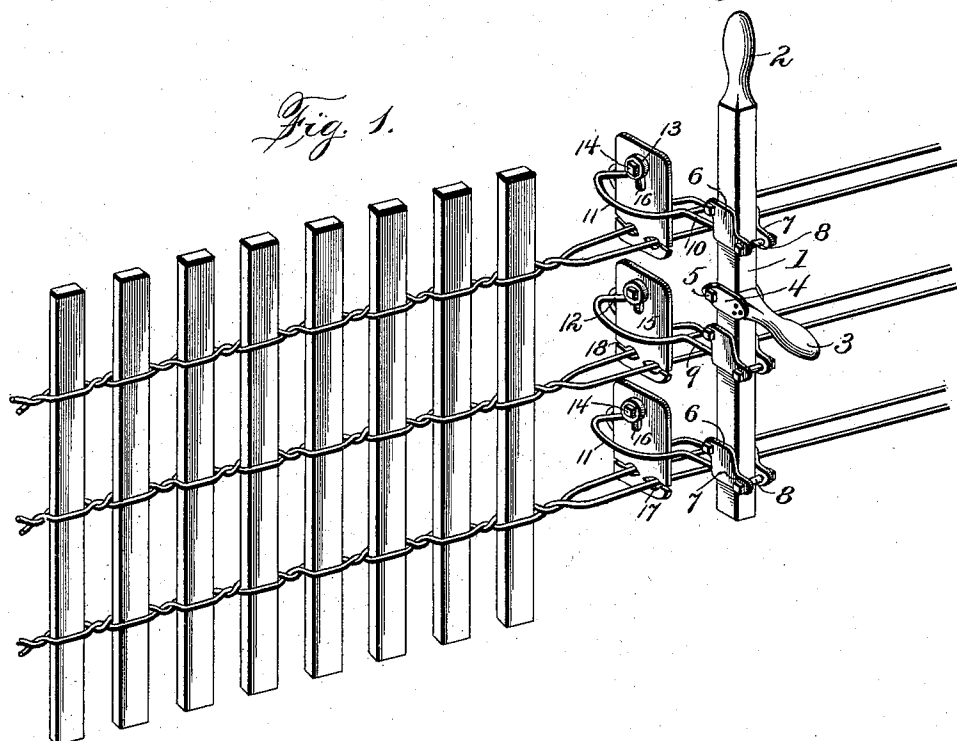

FENCE-WIRING MACHINE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 567,585, dated September 15, 1896.

comprising the straight portions, the intermediate arcuate portions, and the end straight portions inclining backwardly over said arcuate portions, and the twisting-plates, located
5 between said arms which form guides and braces therefor, and said plates having a slot near one end to receive a pivot passing through the ends of said arms and formed at opposite sides with apertures and slanting
10 slots, the construction being such that the

outer portions of said arms will extend beyond the twisting-plates, substantially as shown and described.
