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

DESIGN FOR A FLOOR OIL-CLOTH PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 5,152, dated August 1, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES L. PIERPONT, of city of Salem, county of Salem, State of New Jersey, have originated and designed a new Pattern for Floor Oil-Cloths, Carpets, or other fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings making part of this specification, and marked or designated as design No. 208, which are sufficient without further aid to enable any person skilled in the art to repeat it for practical use.

The colors employed for the different portions of this design may be varied to suit the convenience or taste of the manufacturer.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design or pattern for floor oil-cloths, carpets, or other fabrics, herein set forth.
