

CHARLES E. VAN NORMAN, OF WALTHAM, MASSACHUSETTS.

KEY-HOLDER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 409,255, dated August 20, 1889.

Application filed January 24, 1889. Serial No. 297,341. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES E. VAN NOR-MAN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Waltham, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented new and useful Improvements in Key-Holders, of which the following, taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in key-holders; and it is carried out as follows, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, wherein—

Figure 1 represents a detail perspective 15 view of the improved key-holder and Fig. 2 represents it in use on a chain having keys suspended thereon.

Similar letters refer to similar parts whereever they occur on the different parts of the

20 drawings.

The improved key-holder is preferably made of bent wire, and has in its lower end a loop or eye a adapted to be connected permanently to one end of the chain b, on which the keys c are located. Above or near the loop or eye a the wire is bent in the form of a laterally-projecting loop enlargement or cross-bar a', which serves as a means for preventing the keys from dropping off the chain to b when the other end of the latter is tempo-

rarily detended from the key-holder while keys are being removed from or placed on the said chain. One end of the eye a extends upward in the form of a spring hook, clasp, or bail a'', the bend of which serves for consciung to it one end of the chain b, as shown, and the free end of said hook is adapted, preferably, to lie in contact with the cross-bar or lateral extension a' with a proper amount of yielding spring-pressure, so as to prevent 40 the chain end from being detached from the bail or hook a'' except when manipulated by the operator for such purpose.

What I wish to secure by Letters Patent,

and claim, is-

The key-holder consisting of chain b, the locking device, as described, having an eye a attached to one end of said chain, a crossbar or lateral extension a', and a spring bail or hook a'', adapted to be locked to the opposite end of the said chain, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
