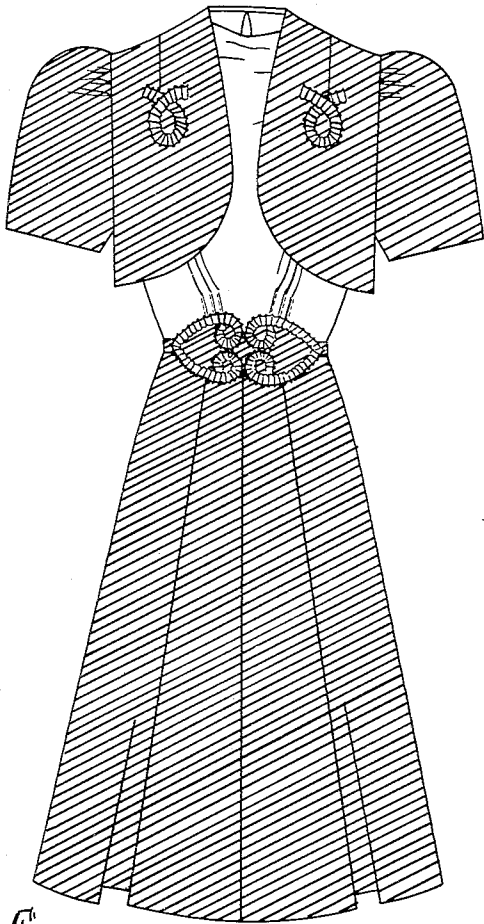

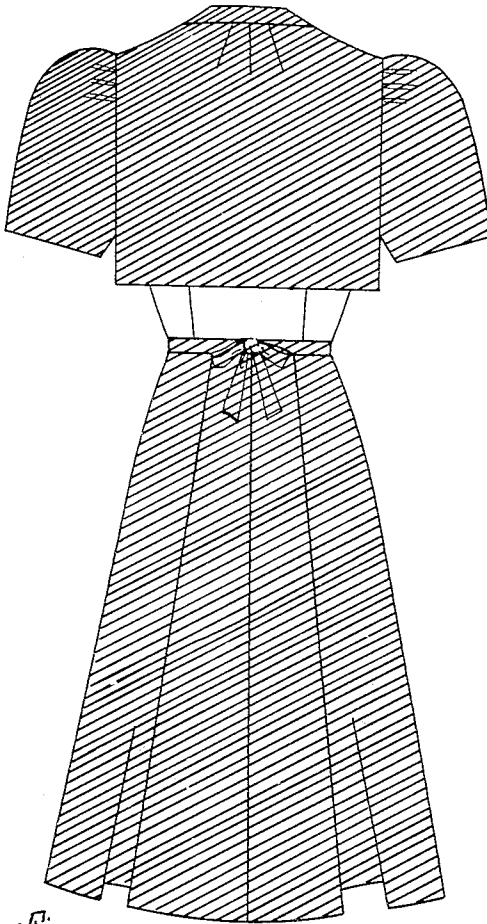

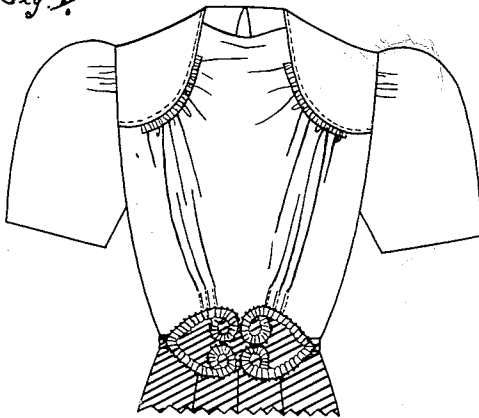

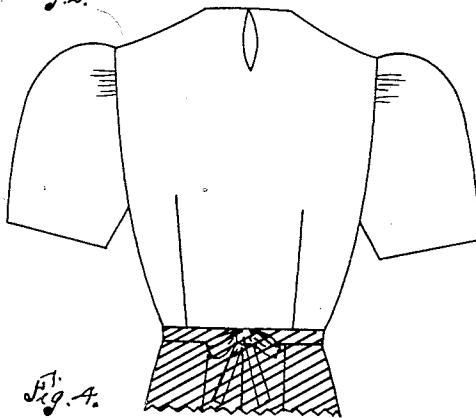

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Maurice Weinstein, a citizen of the United States of America, residing in New York city, county of Bronx, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Dress Ensemble, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
