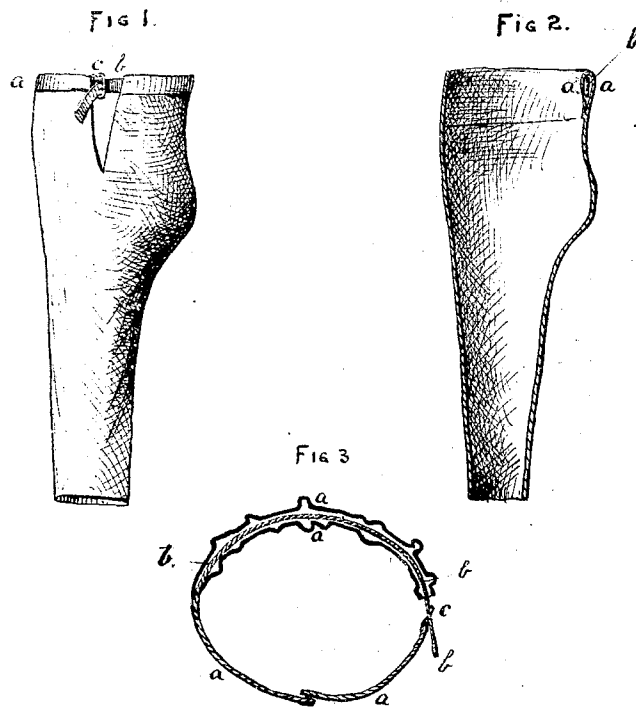

IMPROVEMENT IN PANTALOOON GARMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 127,750, dated June 11, 1872.

Be it known that I, GEORGE R. EAGER, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Pantaloon Garments, of which the following, with the drawing, is a description:

a represents the waistband of the pants, the rear half of which is made hollow. Within this hollow is placed a strap, *b*, to connect with a buckle, *c*, on the front half of the waistband.

The object of the invention is to fit pants of various sizes to the same person by buckling up the strap, and so corrugating the hollow rear part of the waistband, or by letting

out the strap, in which case a slight slit may be necessary in the pants, as at Figure 1. The strap *b* may be a mere prolongation of the front waistband passing through the hollow rear waistband.

I claim—

As a new article of manufacture, pantaloons having a waist constructed substantially as shown and described.
