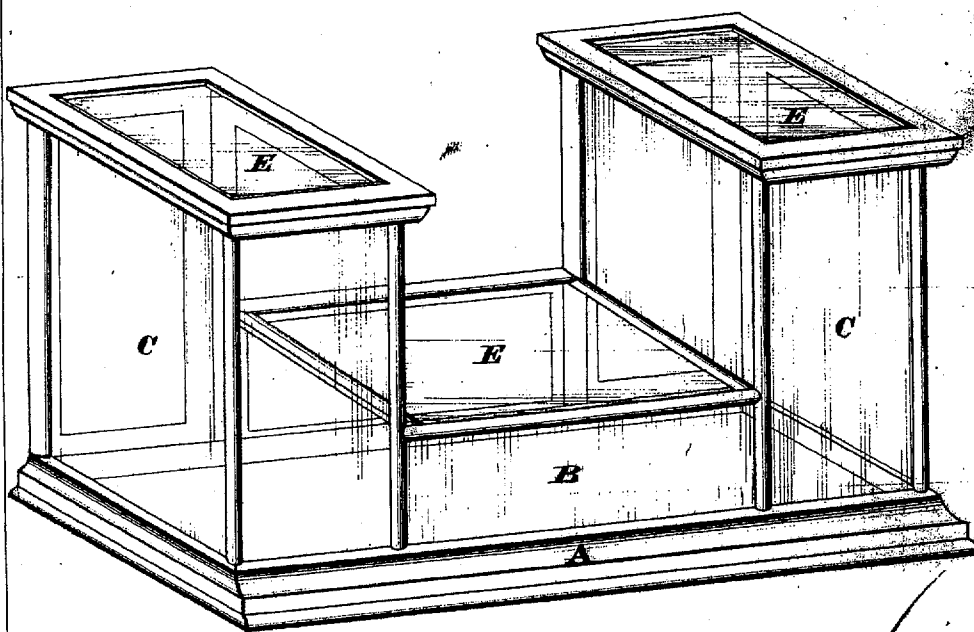
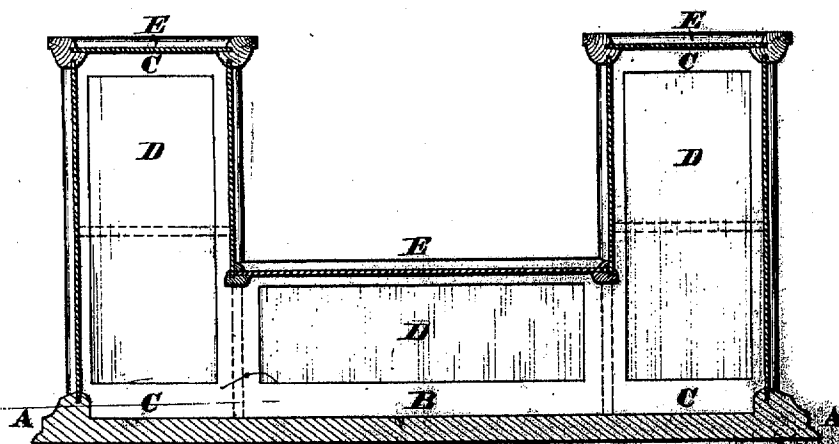

LAWRENCE WIEGEL AND JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, OF CINCINNATI, OHIO.

DESIGN FOR A SHOW-CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **6,136**, dated September 10, 1872.

Specification of a new and Ornamental Design for Show-Cases, originated by LAWRENCE WIEGEL and JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, both of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton and State of Ohio.

Our design is represented in the accompanying drawing, in which Figure 1 is a perspective view of the said show-case. Fig. 2 is a vertical longitudinal section thereof.

A represents the base, finished with an ornate molding, as represented. B is the central part of the case, which is made of ordinary height. C C are vertical end cases flanking the center case B, extending to some height

above the latter, and finished at top with cornices, as shown. D D represent mirrored backs or rear doors, and E E glass tops, both of which may be of common construction. Communication may be had with the interior by doors D or lids E, as desired.

We claim—

The design for a show-case, substantially as above set forth.
