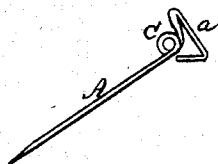
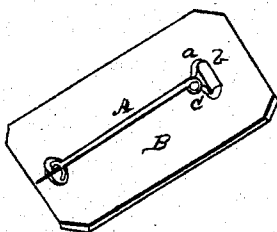

IMPROVEMENT IN FASTENINGS FOR BREAST-PINS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, A. K. P. WALKER, of Richmond, in the county of Sagadahoc, and State of Maine, have invented a new and improved Pin; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification.

This invention relates to the construction of a pin for brooches, shawls, and like purposes, and consists in twisting the head of the pin through the undivided eye of the plate, and providing it with a lateral arm, the end of the head resting upon the plate, to increase the elasticity of the pin, as will be hereinafter more fully described. In the accompanying drawings—

Figure 1 is a view of my pin on a plate or brooch.

Figure 2 is a top view of my pin detached from the eye, and

Figure 3 is a side view thereof.

Similar letters of reference indicate like parts.

A is the pin, B the plate or brooch, *a* the head of the pin, substituted for the ordinary shank and pivot, the head *a* being twisted through the undivided eye *b*. A spiral turn may be given to the pin, as at *c*. The turn, which increases the elasticity of the pin, may also be applied to the pin as ordinarily used.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The pin A, constructed as described, consisting of the head *a*, twisted through the undivided eye *b* of the plate B, and provided with the lateral turn C, the end of the head *a* resting upon the plate, all operating as described, for the purpose specified.
