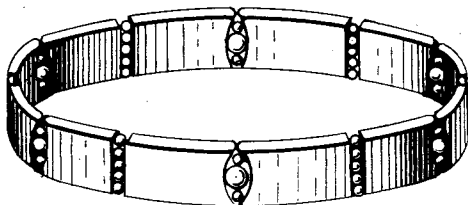

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, TOBIAS A. TOBIASSON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Irvington, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Bracelet or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a perspective view of a bracelet showing my new design.

In said figure is shown a bracelet comprising links or sections with series of balls between said links or sections.

The ornamental design for a bracelet or similar article, as shown and described.
