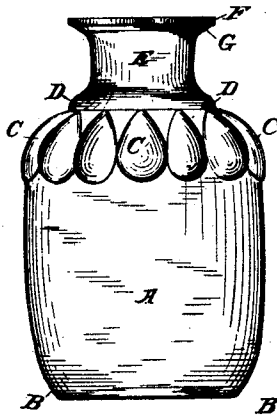

## DESIGN FOR A BOTTLE.

**SPECIFICATION** forming part of Design No. 21,711, dated July 12, 1892.

Application filed May 14, 1892. Serial No. 433,051. Term of patent 14 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, BENJAMIN I. MOTT, a citizen of the United States, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Bottles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, showing said design.

10 The figure of the drawing illustrates an elevation of a bottle, showing my design.

The leading feature of my design consists in the body of the bottle having a partially-rounded contour at its lower or base part and a similar contour at its upper part, the rounding portion at its upper part having a series of projections in tear-drop form, the points of which are presented upwardly and which points rest against or come near to a rounded shoulder at the base of the neck of the bottle. The neck expands in circumferential curvi-

linear fashion at its lower part and also at its upper part, there being, preferably, a flat vertical annular surface at the flat top of the neck, beneath which is or may be produced a slight molding or filling in.

A is the body of the bottle.

B is the curved surface at or near the base.

C are the tear-drops.

D is the shoulder of curvilinear form at the base of the neck.

E is the neck proper.

F is the flat annular portion at the top of the neck, and G is the molding or filling beneath the same.

What I claim is—

The design for a bottle, as herein shown and described.
