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
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(54) Title: METHOD FOR AUDITING INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY



(57) Abstract: A method for auditing one or more intellectual property assets of an entity. The method comprises the steps of: identifying and classifying each intellectual property asset (10); inspecting documentation related to each intellectual property asset (20); determining validity of each intellectual property asset (30); identifying and verifying relevant financial data for each intellectual property asset (40); identifying and verifying a proper tangible valuation formula for each intellectual property asset (50); computing and verifying a tangible valuation for each intellectual property asset using the formula (60); preparing an income statement reflecting revenue and expenses associated with each intellectual property asset (65); preparing a balance sheet reflecting each intellectual property asset and corresponding valuation (70); and issuing an opinion certifying that the one or more intellectual property assets and corresponding tangible values are fairly stated in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (80).
