

(54) Title: WAGERING GAME DEVICE WITH SECURE STORAGE DEVICE



(57) Abstract: Embodiments of a wagering game device with a secure storage device are described herein. In one embodiment, the wagering game device includes a wagering game processor operable to receive a wager for a wagering game. The wagering game device can also include a main memory operable to store wagering game content associated with the wagering game. The wagering game machine can also include a storage device including an encryption unit operable to encrypt the wagering game content and a storage medium operable to store the wagering game content that has been encrypted by the encryption unit.
