*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. FORBELL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Woodhaven Junction, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Statuettes, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

This design is also applicable to such articles as a manikin, a dinner card, a paper weight, an ash tray or a street sign.

Figure 1 is a front view of a statuette illustrating my new design, and

Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.
