


IMPROVED BED-BOTTOM.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Beit known that I, ALEXANDER M. PUGH, of Bucyrus, in the county of Crawford, and State of Ohio, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Spring-Bed Bottoms; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which-

Figure 1 is a plan view of a bedstead with a slat at-

tached, and

Figure 2 is a vertical section, taken in the line x x

The nature of my invention consists in the peculiar formation and combination of wires, by means of which the slats are attached to the springs and bedstead.

To enable others skilled in the art, to make and use my invention, I will proceed to describe its construction and operation.

In each end of the slat A are two holes, through which is inserted the wire B, the ends of which are then bent out past the ends of the slat, and at each

end of said wire B, a hook, C, is formed.

In the head and foot-rails of the bedstead, staples D, of the desired width, are placed, at suitable distances apart.

The hooks C are inserted into eyes E, said eyes

being formed at each end of the wire F.

Around this wire or rod F and the staple D is an elastic band, (4, which connects the slat A to the bed-

It will be seen that with connections as above described, the slats can very readily be removed, and as easily replaced in their former position.

Having thus fully described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The combination of the slat A, and fastening B and F, and web or band G, substantially in the manner shown and described.
