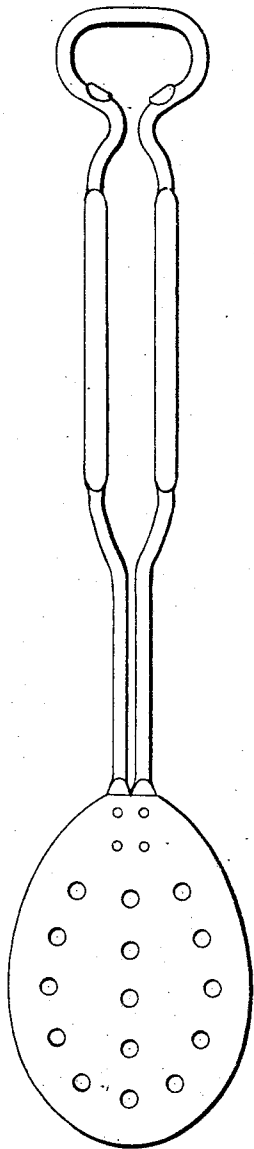

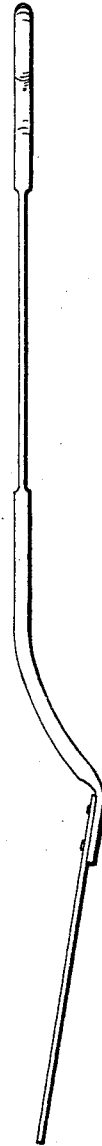

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JOHN L. SOMMER and THOMAS HARDING, both citizens of the United States, residing at Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Cake-Turner or Similar Kitchen Utensil, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
