

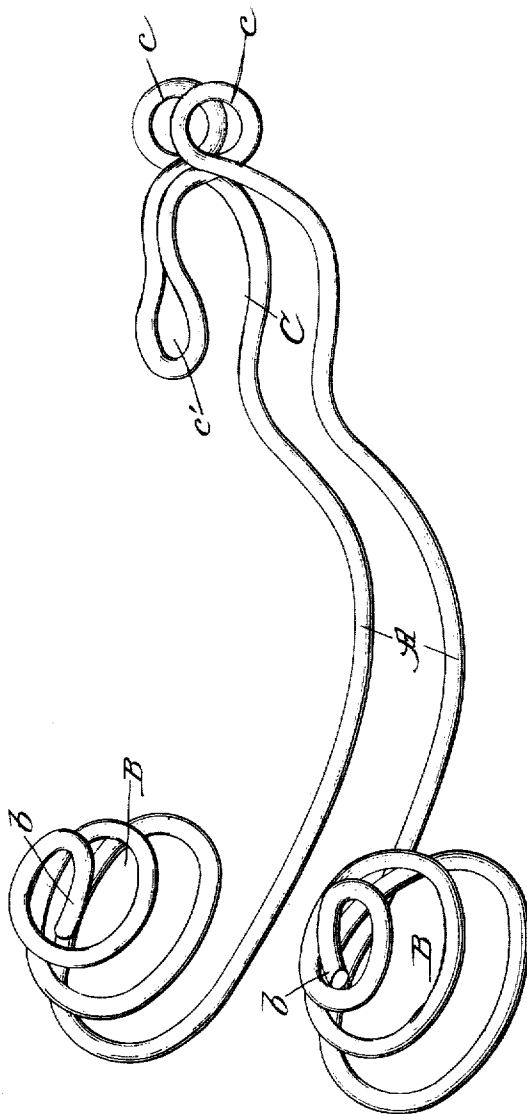

DESIGN FOR A SADDLE-SPRING.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 29,745, dated November 29, 1898.

Application filed November 7, 1898. Serial No. 695,797. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM I. BUNKER, a citizen of the United States, residing at La Grange, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Saddle-Springs, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying drawing is a perspective view of a saddle-spring presenting my design.

In the drawing, A is the saddle-spring, B the wide or coiled portion having eyes *b*, and C the narrow or pommel portion having loops *c* and eye *c'*.

The leading feature of my design consists of a saddle-spring having two coils and two eyes in its rear portion and two loops and one eye in its front portion, the whole presenting an attractive and ornate appearance, as shown in the drawing.

I claim—

The design for a saddle-spring herein shown and described.
