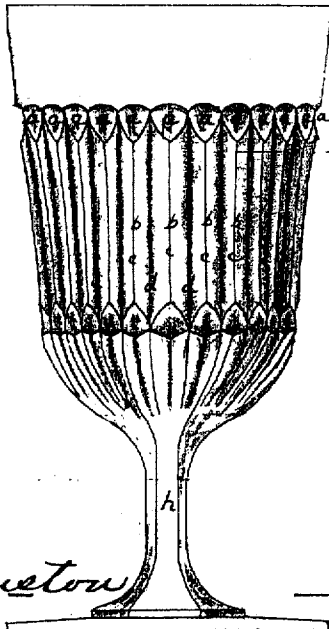

DESIGN FOR A GOBLET.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, J. S. PALMER, of Portland, in the county of Cumberland, and State of Maine, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Glass-Ware, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, in which is shown a view of a goblet with my design thereon.

My design is composed of prisms and figures formed by indentations or depressions in the glass, having three corners, (see *a*,) arranged upon the surface of glass-ware, as hereinafter set forth.

First, there is arranged a row of the three-cornered figures or cuttings *a a*, &c., around the outer circumference of the ware, being in the form or shape illustrated in the drawings, at *a*.

These form hollow or curved indentations in the ware, with raised edges and sides. From these are drawn downward the prisms *b*, highest at the centre *c*, and falling off at each side, so that between each pair of prisms is a v-shaped recess or hollow, (see *d*.)

At the lower end of the prisms are other figures, similar to those at the upper ends of the prisms; then follows a second set of prisms, converging, if necessary, to conform to the narrowing form of the specimen of ware, or to its stem, as *h*.

Above the upper row of the figures marked *a* is the plain surface of the glass.

The figures *a* at the top are broadest at their upper edge, and tapering towards the bottoms. In the row of puntys at the bottom this form is reversed.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for glass-ware, as herein set forth and shown.
