




*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Carlton L. Nelson, a citizen of the United States, residing in East Aurora, Erie County, State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Dinner Plate or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof, in which:

Figure 1 is a top plan view of a dinner plate or similar article showing my new design;

Figure 2 is a side elevational view; and

Figure 3 is a vertical sectional view thereof.
