

DESIGN FOR A DIE FOR MONUMENTS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 31,496, dated September 5, 1899.

Application filed July 20, 1899. Serial No. 724,567. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. YOUNG, a citizen of the United States, residing at Troy, county of Rensselaer, and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Die for Monuments, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, wherein-

Figure 1 is a view in side elevation of a die 01 for a monument embodying my new design, and Fig. 2 is a view in end elevation of the

The design consists in the ornamental con-15 figuration of the die. The ends of the die are of gable form, as shown in Fig. 2, and the sides are surmounted by an arched ornamental molding 1, as shown in Fig. 1, which molding terminates at each corner of the die in an 20 ornamental pendant 2. The top 3 of the die extends in the form of a curved crest or ridge |

from one gable end to the other. The sloping sides of the top are each provided with a tablet 4, the top and bottom edges of which are curved concentrically with the crest. 25 The ends of the die are also provided with tablets 5. The sides are provided with the arched tablets 6 and 7.

The leading feature of the design consists in the gable ends, the sides surmounted by the 30 arched molding, and the curved crest.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design for a die for monuments, herein shown and described.
