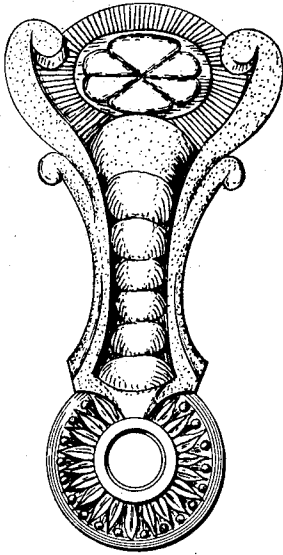
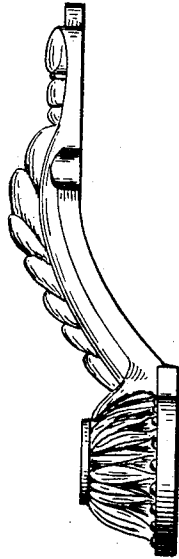

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES WERNER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Cleveland, in the county of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Arm for Lighting-Fixtures, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

In this drawing, Figure 1 is a plan view of an arm for lighting fixtures, showing my new design, and Fig. 2 is a side elevation of the same.
