

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM P. FEENEY, a citizen of the United States, and residing at Valparaiso, in the county of Porter and State of Indiana, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for a Cut-Glass Dish or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the drawings forming a part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is an elevation of a glass dish illustrating the cut ornamentation applied thereto. Figs. 2 and 3, drawn to a larger

scale than Fig. 1, are fragmentary sections of the dish and cutting, the planes of said sections being indicated, respectively, by the lines 2—2 and 3—3 of Fig. 1.

No novelty is claimed herein for the shape of the dish.

The ornamental design for a cut glass dish or similar article, as shown.
