IMPROVEMENT IN STOVE-POLISH.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **179,277**, dated June 27, 1876; application filed May 27, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES H. CURFEW and ALFRED HALL, of Fiskedale, Worcester county, Massachusetts, have invented a new and Improved Compound for Stove-Polish, of which the following is a specification:

Our improved compound consists of plumbago, one pound; nitrate of silver, thirty grains; common table-salt, thirty grains; and cream-tartar, ten and one-half grains, mixed together and pulverized—the said compound being an improved polish for stoves, and any other iron-work requiring a brilliant luster, which can be produced by it with less labor than is necessary with those now in use.

It is to be mixed to the consistency of cream, and applied by a woolen rag, or other suitable device.

Having thus described our invention, we claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The compound of plumbago, nitrate of silver, salt, and cream-tartar, substantially in the proportions stated, and for the purpose specified.
