





*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LOUIS WEIDLICH, a citizen of the United States, and resident of Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Jewel-Case, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

In the drawings: Figure 1 shows a top plan view of my new design of jewel case. Fig. 2 is a front elevation of the design, and Fig. 3, is a side elevation of the same.
