

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW J. JACKSON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Jersey City, county of Hudson, State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Stem and Mouthpiece for Smoking-Pipes, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a side elevation of the combined stem and mouth piece, a pipe bowl being shown in dotted lines.

The ornamental design for a stem and mouth-piece for smoking pipes, as shown.
