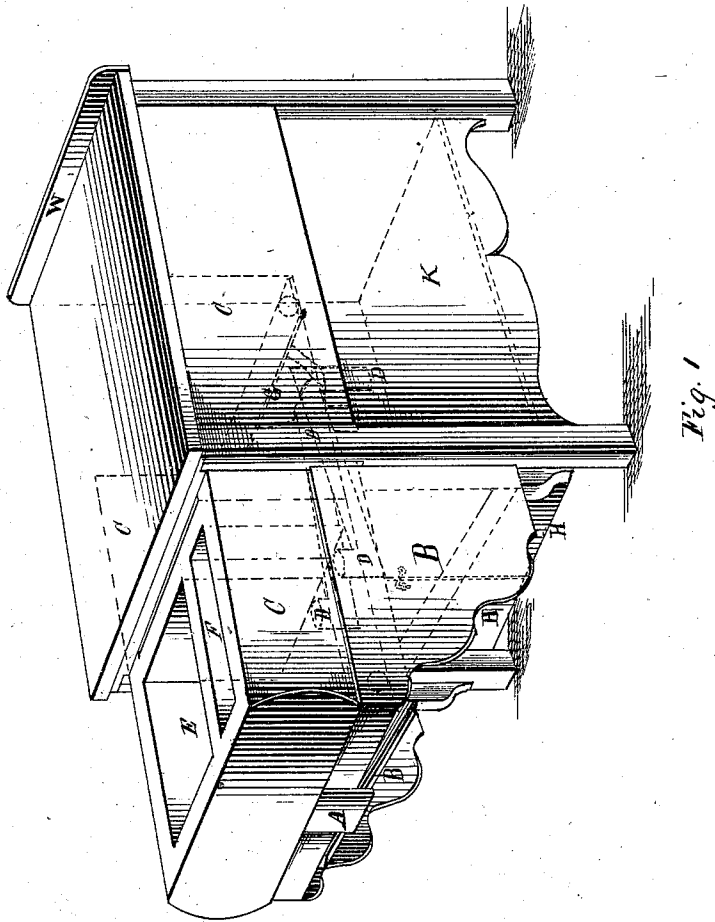

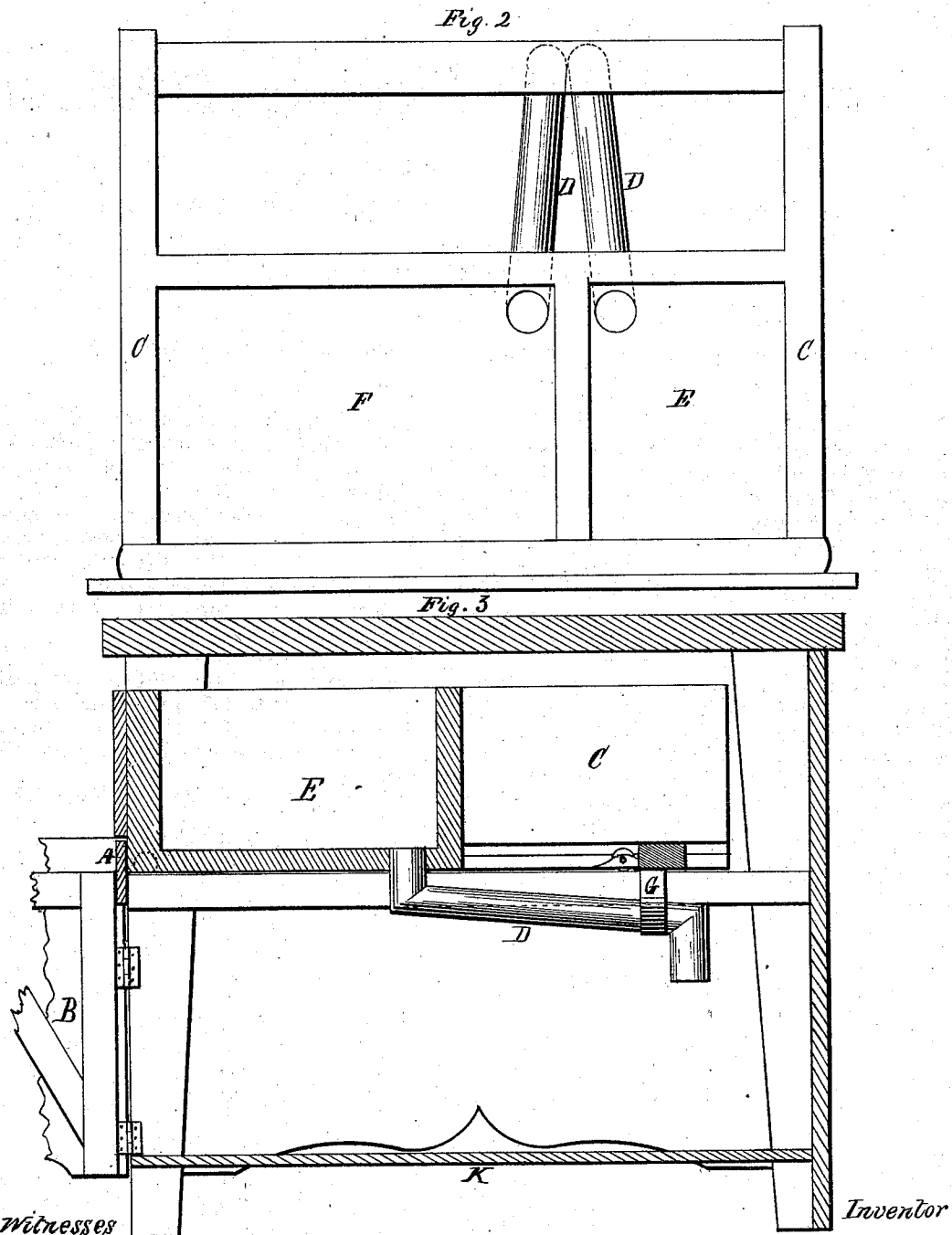

IMPROVEMENT IN KITCHEN-SINKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 136,802, dated March 11, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICH WYTTEBACH, of Evansville, in the county of Vanderburgh and State of Indiana, have invented a Shifting Kitchen-Sink, combined with table and closet, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to the combination of a shifting kitchen-sink with a table, in such a manner that the sink is hid when not in use.

Two braces hung on the front table-legs support the sink when in actual use, and there is a closet under the shifting kitchen-sink, for setting a bucket under the drain-pipes, and for stowing away stove utensils.

A is the key to B B, and can be diminished or increased, according to the length of the sink, and is used for a hand-grip for drawing out the sink. B B are the braces that support the sink when in actual use. C C are the

side ends of the sink, which have one sash-roller and a wheel each, to make it shift easy. D D are the drain-pipes. E is the sink to wash dishes in. F is the sink to rinse and drain the dishes. G is a cross-bar to support the drain-pipes. H H are the closet doors. K is the closet floor. W is a wall-board in which are two holes to fasten the table to the wall to keep it from tipping forward when the sink is in actual use.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of the shifting compartment sink, E T, provided with hand-grip A and drain-pipes D D, with hinged brackets B B, and closet, all constructed and arranged as described.
