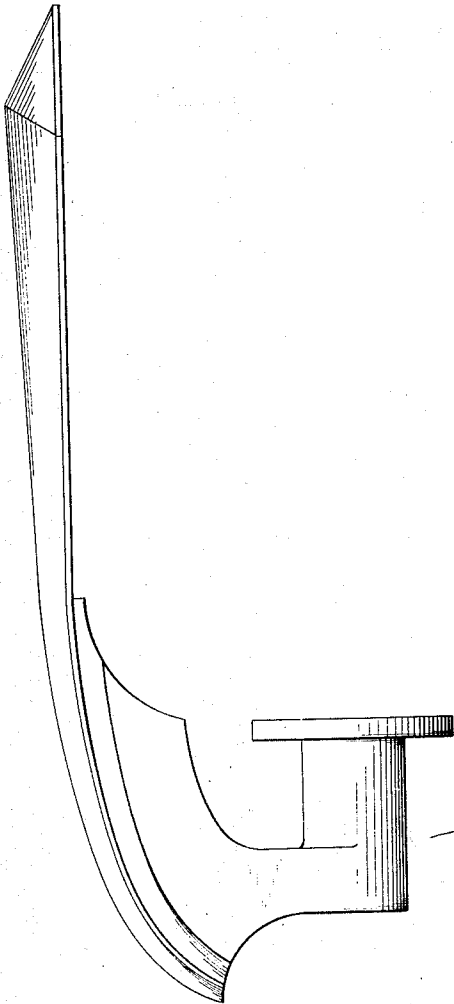

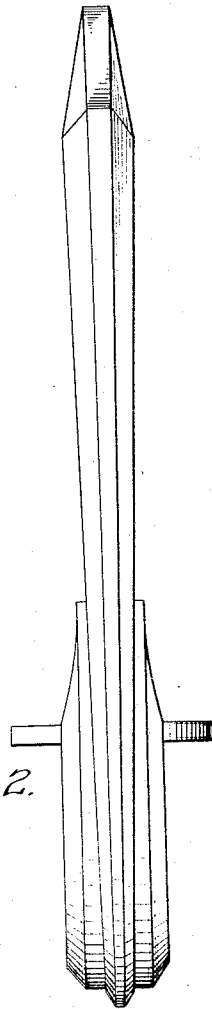

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known, that I, Paul M. Fuller, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental design for Caster Supporting Bracket or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a side elevation of the bracket embodying my design. Figure 2 is a front elevation of the same.
