IMPROVEMENT IN DENTIFRICES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OLIVER DANFORTH, of the county of Bibb and State of Georgia, have invented a new and useful Tooth-Wash or Dentifrice, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my invention consists in certain ingredients found in the *Materia Medica*, which, when combined either in the exact proportions hereinafter stated or a slight variation therefrom, will constitute a valuable compound dentifrice.

To prepare this dentifrice I take castile soap, avoirdupois, one drachm; glycerine, one and a half fluid drachm; alcohol, ninety-five per cent., one and a half

fluid drachm; cologne mixture, one and a half fluid drachm; oil of cassia, one minim; chloroform, ten minims; which are to be properly mixed, and will constitute a compound of liquid consistence, to be known as Danforth's Sanative Dentifrice.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim is—

A dentifrice or tooth-wash, composed of the ingredients in or about the proportions above specified.
